On I January 2020 we opened applications for the Project Prod Team, appointed a fabulous group of creatives, secured our show and started the process of designing and creating our 2020 Project Production. When we opened audition and band applications in February, we received more applications than ever before – we were all set for the biggest Project so far – and the last we would stage in our resident theatre at Stuartholme School.

Auditions cautiously went ahead just as Australia was seeing the start of our first wave of Covid-19. We watched every development in the news from the audition table, and the next day, Schools closed in Brisbane and we experienced for the first time what would become 'the new normal'.

We were so glad to have that weekend of auditions, a wonderful two days of performances and community spirit, but regrettably that production was postponed... then postponed again...

Our community spirit continued to shine though and when the Project Weekend rolled around our Alumni stepped up with individual 24 hour challenges to fundraise for our primary charity partner, The Actors' and Entertainers' Benevolent Fund of Qld. We raised over \$6000 for the Fund, more than we ever have before, and at a time when they needed it more than ever before. With the 2020 Production now postponed to

October 2021, we had a unique opportunity for a TWO PROJECT year! And so, we decided to do something a little different with our April Project: a sung-through show. We looked at reviews and song-cycles, and then we happened upon... Starlight Express. While the roller-skates were literally an accident waiting to happen, once we took them out of the equation, we had a sung-through show with lots of roles, interesting music and torch-light choreography! What more could you ask for?!

Despite recent events in Greater Brisbane, the team have pulled together (while remaining physically distanced!) to ensure the Project goes ahead with our usual community spirit. And as we see theatre and live performance starting again across Australia and all over the world, we can finally see the light at the end of the tunnel.

REDUT THE PROJECT

The 24 Hour Musical Project is a community fundraising venture in support of The Actors' and Entertainers' Benevolent Fund of Qld and other charitable causes. We bring together the local theatre community for one weekend of madness, mayhem and goodwill.

The challenge is to produce a full-scale musical in just 24 hours, but the purpose is really to get as many people as we can from as many different companies as we can to work together to achieve a common goal. The Project is an opportunity to build and strengthen our theatre community and raise funds for some good causes at the same time. Everyone wins!

The Project is unique in the way it is structured, with a blind audition process in which none of the auditionees know what they're auditioning for; a Production Team who work through the whole show without the performers; and perhaps most unusually, a Support Director and Catering Coordinator are among the most important roles in the team.

Of course, the greatest advantage of the Project is the short-term commitment. Participants

need only set aside one weekend for the experience and as a result we get a wonderful mix of people who are ready to do their best at whatever we throw at them.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

- 1. Pick a show (yes, the production team know what the show is!)
- 2. Audition... without telling anyone what the show is
- 3. Cast the show... without telling anyone which roles they have
- 4. Assemble the band... without giving them any music
- 5. Plan and prepare the show in secret
- 6. Gather the crew and support volunteers
- 7. Release a shortlist of 10 shows...
- 8. Remove a show from the list each day until...
- 9. The last show standing is IT!
- 10. Rehearse for 24 hours and then finally put on a show!



ABOUT THE SHOW

Starlight Express is written by Andrew Lloyd Webber (music) and Richard Stilgoe (lyrics). It was first produced in 1984 in London's West End and has been produced all over the world since then – it's been running in Germany for 30 years and counting!

SYNOPSIS

When the children are asleep, their toys play, especially the engines and carriages of the train set. They race across the set in a series of contests.

There's the macho Greaseball, the fastest diesel, in contrast to Rusty, the little steam engine who merely works in the sidings.

From Germany there's Ruhrgold, Italy offers Espresso, Turnov the engine from Russia, Japan's Nintendo and, at the last minute, the electrically powered super engine, Electra.

They vie for superiority along with the best coaches, trucks and coponents. And who will win the heart of the brand-new First-Class Carriage, Pearl.

Just to make things more difficult, there's a two-timing Red Caboose, who does all he can to sabotage Rusty and leave the way clear for Greaseball and Electra.

One by one the bigger, more powerful locos come to grief. Rusty's Poppa wins an eliminator, but Rusty, with the help of the Starlight Express (his guiding star in the sky), must take over.

He defeats Electra, and Pearl realises that Rusty is her engine. Greaseball may have a future - converted to steam with Dinah, the Dining Car.

There's a light at the end of the tunnel, and old-fashioned steam has won over the new technologies of Diesel and Electricity.
